Flamingo Bay Landfill and Test Areas Proposed Plan

Virtual Public Meeting and Comment Period

The U.S. military acquired Water Island during World War II for an Army coastal defense installation known as Fort Segarra. The Army began constructing the fort, but the war ended before it was completed. By 1950, the military had removed materials related to their training and transferred the island to the U.S. Department of Interior. The land was later transferred to the U.S. Virgin Islands government.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) recently completed a Remedial Investigation to determine if anything hazardous remains from the military's training, and the results of the investigation and recommendations are summarized in a Proposed Plan.
