Dear Community Partner,

The Virgin Islands Department of Human (VIDHS) Services is pleased to announce the opportunity to partner with us to help keep our St. John/Water Island community safe by supplying a non-congregate sheltering choice for residents.

Due to the global COVID-19 Pandemic, we are exploring options to include congregate and non-congregate sheltering. Historically, the Government of the Virgin Islands (GVI) has provided evacuation/congregate sheltering on St. John at Julius Sprauve School and on Water Island the VI Fire Station. Although this congregate sheltering site is available and a practical option, best practices for sheltering is practicing social distancing. This is best done through non-congregate sheltering (i.e. hotels, dormitories, campgrounds, individual rooms).

Our ASK to owners of condos, apartments and villas is to partner with us to supply non-congregate sheltering during the 2020 Hurricane Season (June 1 – November 30, 2020). The VIDHS will screen all residents when entering a congregate shelter 24-48 hours prior to an impending storm. In the event a resident is not able to be in a congregate shelter, (i.e. an individual who is asymptomatic high-risk individuals needing social distancing as a precautionary measure, such as people over 65 or with certain underlying health conditions (respiratory, compromised immunities, chronic disease and/or have a temperature of 100.4 or above) would be referred to a non-congregate shelter. The length of time in a non-congregate shelter depends on the need and may be negotiated individually.
